→ Tacoma Gang Project

Greetings, As you may know, this year the Tacoma City Council has allocated funding to develop a comprehensive gang assessment and construct a realistic implementation plan launching the 2011 Tacoma Gang Project. The City of Tacoma has determined that addressing youth violence and gang activity is a high priority. To date, a broadly diverse Executive Steering Committee has been formed, a working relationship with the National Gang Center has been developed and several meetings have been held with the community to inform and engage them in this project.

The City has hired a Research Partner to accomplish the following:

- 1.) Compile a broad array of specific community data**
- 2.) Determine the scope of the gang issues facing Tacoma**
- 3.) Identify specific implementation strategies**
